Common Lands	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Collectively, the properties described in the Town Deed as constituting the Cranberry Lands, the Face of the Cliffs, and the Herring Creek
Commonwealth	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Commonwealth of Massachusetts
Commonwealth Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The law entitled <i>An Act to Implement the Settlement of the Gay Head Indian Land Claims</i> enacted by the General Court of the Commonwealth in 1985 and signed into law by the Governor on September 18, 1985
Cook Properties	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The real property described in the Town Deed as constituting The Cook Properties
Cranberry Lands	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The real property described in the Town Deed as constituting The Cranberry Lands

Settlement Agreement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Joint Memorandum of Understanding Concerning Settlement of the Gay Head, Massachusetts Indian Land Claims dated September 28, 1983 among the Town, the Tribal Council, the GHTA and the Commonwealth settling the Law Suit
Settlement Lands	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collectively, the Common Lands (namely the Cranberry Lands, the Face of the Cliffs and the Herring Creek) and the Strock Estate
Strock Deed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The deed dated February 1, 1988 pursuant to which Moshop Trail Limited Partnership granted the real property described therein to the United States of America in trust for the benefit of the Tribe
Strock Estate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The real property which was the subject of Strock Deed
Town	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Town of Gay Head, Dukes County, Massachusetts
Town Deed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The deed dated June 29, 1992 pursuant to which the Town granted the real property described therein to the United States of America in trust for the benefit of the Tribe
Tribal Council	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wampanoag Tribal Council of Gay Head, Inc., from its formation in 1972 until its recognition in February, 1987 as an Indian tribe

Tribe

- Wampanoag Tribe of Gay Head (Aquinnah), formerly named and known as the Wampanoag Tribal Council of Gay Head, Inc., subsequent to its recognition as an Indian tribe in February, 1987

Zoning By-laws

- The Zoning By-laws of the Town as in effect at the time the Land Use Plan was put into effect and at the time the Commonwealth Act was enacted
